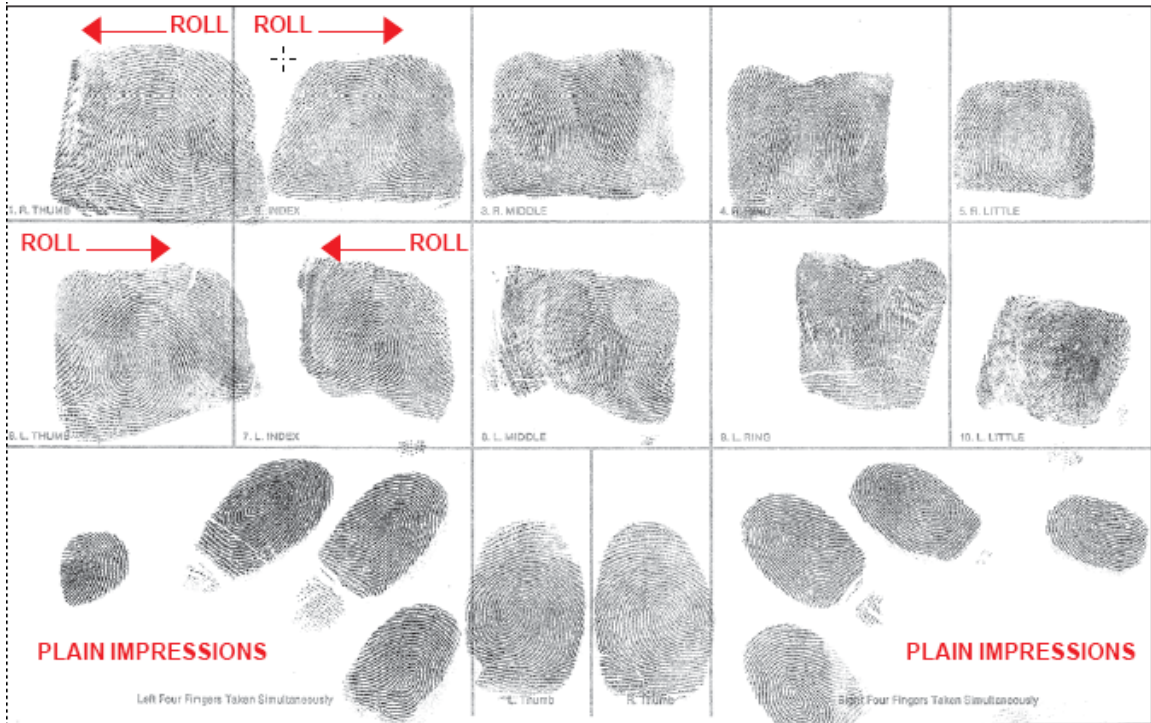


## TAKING FINGERPRINTS

Taking fingerprints is more practice than art. The diligent learner can become accomplished at taking legible prints.

You will need to learn how to be socially comfortable to take fingerprints and spend some time practicing.

What equipment do you need?

- Ink
- Roller (if using)
- Print area and paper
- Soap & clean up supplies

Three steps (PowerPoint Handout)

Turn in your prints. Make sure you put your name on the **BACK** of your print sheet. List your subject on the front of the sheet. Remember to list on your print sheet if the subject has a disability or problem with one appendage.
